



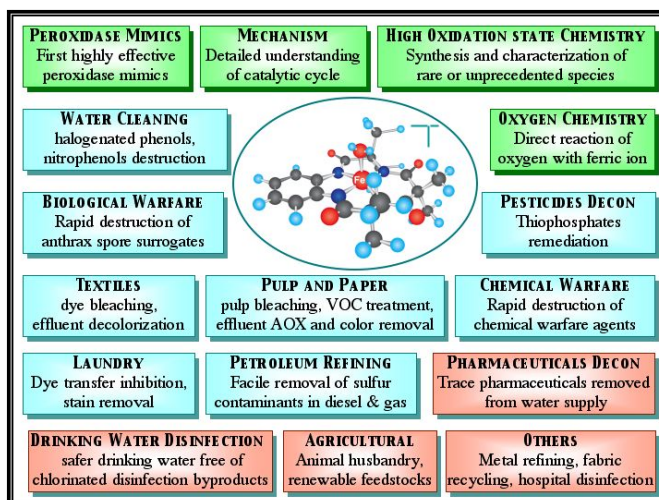

All abstracts should include the following information: title, author(s), location of research, and the abstract. Abstracts must be no longer than 150 words in length. The enclosed submission form may be photocopied as needed.

Posters must fit in a 4' x 4' space. All posters should be in place by 10:00 AM. Students with even numbered poster assignments must be present at posters from 2 - 3:00 PM to answer any questions. Students with odd numbered posters must be present from 3 - 4:00 PM. This will allow all students time to view other posters and ask questions. Poster number assignments may be checked on the web after July 27th.

Plenary Session: Authors of eight outstanding abstracts will be selected to participate in the plenary session. Presentations will be 15 minutes each. Power Point presentations can be brought on a disk for computer presentation. Slide and overhead projectors will also be available. If you do not wish to be considered for the plenary session, please indicate this on the web form or the enclosed form.
